The first year Vermont Troops and Families organized the annual golf tournament in 2019, it raised over \$30,000.00. This money was donated to the VT National Guard Charitable Foundation. This Foundation provides financial support to VT National Guard families in need while their loved ones are deployed.

David is a member the Patient Family Advisory Council (PFAC) at the Boston Medical Center. The PFAC aims to improve operations across the BMC health system and achieve their mission for patientcentered and equitable care.
