

Articulation Agreement

Between
Boston Architectural College

Master of Architecture

And
Sheridan College

Architectural Technician/Technology Program

This document will serve as the official articulation agreement to allow Sheridan College graduates to move into the **Master of Architecture** at Boston Architectural College (hereinafter BAC).

Agreement

Upon successful completion of Architectural Technician/Technology Program at Sheridan College:

1. Graduates meeting all BAC admission criteria will be granted up to 42.5 credits towards their **Master of Architecture** degree. Full-time students can expect to complete the **Master of Architecture** in 2 years of study after graduating from Sheridan College.
2. This agreement is valid for 5 years from the signing date.

Admission Criteria for Master of Architecture

General Admission Criteria

1. Sheridan College students wishing to plan their transfer to BAC are encouraged to communicate early with their academic advisors at Sheridan College and the BAC's admissions office to ensure that they meet prerequisites for the program and to secure specific information about transfer credits and degree requirements.
2. The student will submit a regular application for admission to the BAC. The student will pay the regular application fee.
3. Students will be required to complete all remaining courses at the BAC, unless otherwise approved by the BAC, to complete their degree requirements.
4. Students who have additional college or university credits may request to have them recognized as credit equivalencies at their own expense. The BAC's Admissions Office shall decide the granting of credit equivalencies.

5. Sheridan College will provide an official transcript for each student transitioning to the BAC.
6. Graduates of Sheridan College can expect to receive credit based on the course structure provided in **Appendix A**.
7. The tuition for Sheridan College students will be the same published price as it is for all BAC master students, with the same access and criteria for any possible financial aid or awards.

Quality Assurance

As a partner in this articulation each party agrees to:

1. Make information about this agreement available to students.
2. Notify the other party with as much lead time as possible of any changes in excess of 25% to the curriculum of the Credential(s) outlined above.
3. Notify the other party with as much lead time as possible of any anticipated or approved changes to admission requirements for the Program(s) approved in this agreement.

Quality Assurance – Changes to the Agreement

1. Changes to the agreement must be communicated, in writing, with as much notice as possible.
2. Changes to the agreement will take effect at the beginning of the subsequent academic year.
3. Agreements may be cancelled, in writing, with as much notice as possible. Agreements cancelled during the academic year will remain valid until the end of the current academic year.

Quality Assurance – Receiving Institution

1. Annually, the BAC will share aggregate information about enrollment in the Program(s) listed in this agreement.

Administration, quality assurance, and implementation of this agreement will be through the **Admissions Office** at the BAC and the program coordinator of the Architectural Technology/Technician program Adrian Bica at Sheridan College.

Promotion

Both parties may promote this agreement using existing channels. Both parties will reference this agreement on their websites. In regard to such promotion each party licenses to the other party the right, on a non-exclusive basis, during the term hereof to use the name and logo of the other party to promote, to its students, the Program(s) listed herein.

1. Each party will provide the other with sufficient marketing collateral to promote the agreement. Parties will not be responsible for producing any part of the other institution's marketing collateral.
2. The BAC will have an opportunity to visit Sheridan College's campus or other forums to promote the agreement. Any costs associated with campus visits are the responsibility of the BAC.

No Claims or Recourse Against the Crown

The remedies, recourse or rights of BAC shall be limited to Sheridan and to the right, title and interest owned by Sheridan in and to all of its personal property, whether now existing or hereinafter arising or acquired from time to time; and BAC unconditionally and irrevocably waives and releases all other claims, remedies, recourse or rights against the Crown in right of Ontario in respect of the Agreement, and agrees that it shall have no remedies, recourse or rights in respect of the Agreement against the Crown in right of Ontario, any Ministry, Minister, agent, agency, servant, employee or representative of the Crown or any director, officer, servant, agent, employee or representative of a Crown agency or a corporation in which the Crown holds a majority of the shares or appoints a majority of the directors or members, other than against Sheridan and its assets.

No Indemnity

Notwithstanding anything herein or in any other agreement to the contrary, neither Party to this Agreement shall have any obligation to indemnify the other Party or any third party to this Agreement against costs, in connection with any matter related to or arising out of the Program or the subject matter hereof.

Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the applicable jurisdiction wherein the matter arises.

Each party acknowledges that it has no authority to assume or create any obligation, explicit or implied, on behalf of the other party, except and solely as specifically stipulated in this agreement. Each party acknowledges that it has no authority to bind the other party in any way whatsoever or to render the other party liable.

This agreement will be in effect for a period of five years starting on the day it was signed, at which point the agreement will be reviewed for renewal. Should the agreement not be renewed, students who are currently enrolled in the Articulating School programs listed under this agreement will be permitted to complete their studies at either institution under this agreement.

Sheridan College and Boston Architectural College officials hereby affix their signatures as acceptance of the above conditions.
